



2019 SGA Election Voting Guide

During every spring semester, the University of Louisville elects the officers and senators that will serve as the voice of the student body to the administration of the University and the colleges that comprise it. By the end of the spring Semester, the "Top Four" university-wide officers and college senators that comprise Student Government Association will be elected and installed for the following academic year.


Student Government has an election process that seeks to effectively represent students across the University community. Elections vary based on college. The SGA Supreme Court administers the General Election, and every individual college council has the option to participate in the General Election or conduct their own independent election for the positions that represent their college.

Council presidents and vice presidents, along with a certain number of their council members, have voting privileges and represent their colleges as senators in the Student Senate. Councils of various colleges may have other positions that will be elected per the same ballot but will not have representation in the Student Senate. This guide will only list the positions that are represented within the Student Government Executive Branch and the Student Senate.

General Election Information

The SGA Supreme Court administers the General Election and establishes the official election rules. The election for university-wide officers and the listed colleges will occur in the General Election. The electronic ballot used to vote in the General Election is developed by the University's Office of Academic Planning and Accountability. The ballot will be distributed to students via their University email, and students will also be able to access their ballot via Blackboard or through a link found on the SGA election's homepage (http://www.louisville.edu/student/elections). Please note, the Blackboard ballot will not appear until the email ballot is has been sent. Students will be able to vote: Feb. 18 – Feb. 21. Note: The ballot will close at 12 am on Feb. 21 so all voting must be done by 11:59 pm on Feb. 20.


